**Q1** Do you strongly approve, somewhat approve, somewhat disapprove or strongly disapprove of how the Oklahoma State Legislature is doing its job?

**Q4** In 2005, more than 2.1 million people were registered to vote in Oklahoma, according to Oklahoma state Election Board statistics. Ten years later and with about 10 percent more residents, 119,280 fewer Oklahoma residents were registered to vote than in 2005. **Q5** There is a proposal to change the electoral system by replacing party primaries with a single nonpartisan primary. All the candidates would appear on the same ballot, regardless of what party they represent. All the voters would be eligible to vote in the primary, including independent voters. The two candidates that receive the most votes in the primary go on to compete in the general election to determine who is elected. This initiative would ensure that all candidates, regardless of party affiliation, face the same requirements to run for office. It would ensure that all voters can participate in the primaries and vote for candidates of their choice. And it would ban the use of taxpayer money from paying for private political party elections. Knowing what you know right now, would you definitely vote yes on this initiative, would you probably vote yes, would you probably vote no, or would you definitely vote no?

**Q6** Please tell me if you find each argument very convincing, somewhat convincing, not too convincing, or not convincing at all. Here's the first one: Oklahoma's partisan system produces state leaders and state legislators who represent ideological fringes and special interest groups, not the people. As a result Oklahoma has the lowest level of voter participation in the country. People don't feel like their voices are being heard. We can disrupt the dysfunctional status quo by enacting a nonpartisan election system that allows everyone to vote in the primaries and forces the candidates to appeal to all the voters. **Q7** Here's the next one: In Nebraska, which has used the nonpartisan top two primary system for 70 years, there is no party discipline, which leads to a chaotic legislature where, as one critic put it, "you've got 49 free agents, and no one is running the show." Furthermore, critics say that having a nonpartisan legislature in Nebraska has led to more liberal legislative outcomes, such as repealing the death penalty, raising gas taxes, and allowing drivers licenses to be issued to workers who are here illegally. Nonpartisan Top Two primaries in Nebraska have created more chaos and more liberal policies, not better representation.

**Q10** Here's the next one: Nebraska uses a nonpartisan primary system to elect its State Legislators, and the system is working there very well. Democrats and Republicans work together to solve problems, and left/right coalitions come together to focus on specific issues. What you see in Nebraska is when you have nonpartisan elections, you empower the voters and create incentives for politicians to find ways to work together to make progress on the issues people care about.

**Q11** Here's the next one: If you change to a nonpartisan "Top Two" primary system, you reduce voter choice because only the top two candidates make it out of the primary round and appear on the November ballot. This would be bad for Oklahoma because the November election is the most important and limiting the ballot to the "top two" would reduce voter choice. Plus, in some races, the top two candidates might be two Democrats or two Republicans.

If we elected those leaders using a nonpartisan primary system, we could send a strong message to Washington and to other states that it's time to end the partisanship and dysfunction in Washington.
